# Call for papers

## Scope of the conference

Key motto of the 2009 conference is:

**Taking up the global challenge: analysing the implementation of innovations and governance for sustainable development.**

The conference aims to enable sustainability researchers from developed and developing countries to learn from each other's experience and jointly create solutions for making progress in sustainable development. Starting from the need for fundamental changes towards a sustainable future, the conference program will focus on the many larger and smaller developments in implementing practices of sustainable development. Researchers will be challenged to look at factors explaining the levels of success and to analyse key issues for mainstreaming these practices. The aim is to promote the debate on the key question whether the developments in these practices and their mainstreaming are sufficiently substantial to face the fast growing global wealth and its implications for environment and mankind in the coming decades. Both the academic research character and lessons from practice will thus be emphasised.

The 15<sup>th</sup> Annual Conference is a double blind peer reviewed conference. Abstracts are sent to reviewers and written comments are provided to the authors. Papers from the conference are considered for publication in special issues of various international scientific peer reviewed journals.

The conference has now opened its call for papers in the 5 main themes, including 24 tracks.

- **Climate Change and Energy**
- **Sustainable Land Use**
- **Innovation for Sustainable Production and Consumption**
- **Governance for Sustainable Development**
